LARGE 1948 PEACH CROP PREDICTED IN MICHIGAN

Michigan expects a good peach harvest again this year, according to reports coming into the Michigan Department of Agriculture. Erich Kerlikowske of Benton Harbor, a large fruit grower in Berrien County, and a member of the Commission of Agriculture and Director of the National Peach Council, reports that records of the Council show all peach-producing states expect a good crop. The estimated crop of 3,750,000 bushels of Michigan peaches is nearly a half million bushels above the 10-year average, according to State and Federal Crop Reporting Services.

Department of Agriculture records show that of last year's peach crop, besides a large amount marketed in the state, many shipments were made to 23 different states and Canada. Michigan has long been a leader in the production of

peaches, ranking fourth among the states of the nation, generally climatic the season's harvest. Early varieties are beginning to appear on city markets. The bulk of the crop will begin ripening about the 20th of this month, with the biggest harvest usually coming the first two weeks in September. With good rains in the peach areas of Michigan, there should be very good size peaches to harvest and the quality should be exceptional so that particular housewives should have no difficulty getting their peach canning requirements.

Painting Don'ts

Turkeys Need Shade During Hot Weather

Hot weather is particularly hard on turkey flocks, points out Charles Reed, extension poultryman at Michigan State College. He recommends plenty of shade for the birds during August.

Last year, large numbers of turkeys were killed by heat prostration during the hot weather. Other flocks failed to continue to grow at the normal rate during this period even though there were few that died from the heat.

In some cases, Reed explains, the flock had shelter but not enough to accommodate all of the birds. Those that could not find room in the shade had to stand in the sun. In other cases where shade was inadequate all of the birds tried to crowd into the shady space and as a result, they piled up and smothered.

Reed urges every grower to check available shade and to provide more if necessary. He reports that many growers are permitting the birds to range in the corn fields. This is done because growing corn provides plenty of shade after the tasseling stage.
