

In the Farmington vicinity there are several ranches and riding stables so that the mere existence of a ranch is nothing unusual. We do have one ranch close by, however, which is a little different inasmuch as it has become a sort of paradise for horses.

We refer to Little Creek Ranch at 23565 W. Ten Mile Road. On the property there are about 100 horses who have been purchased from stables or from individual owners. The horses may need some medical treatment, or they may need a good rider, or they may need attention and that is why you will find them at Little Creek Ranch. The horses are kept at the ranch as long as necessary until they are once again in the hands of a good rider. When they are found for them, most of them being purchased by individuals who want a horse for their own personal use.

Another unusual practice at Little Creek Ranch is the maintenance of a veterinary fund. Cotten and soft drinks are sold, and the profits are placed in a special fund for the benefit of the horses. It comes ill, whether he is one of the horses owned by the Ranch, or if he is merely being boarded there. The veterinary is called and his fees are taken care of from this special fund, at no additional cost to any one.

Perhaps you would like to visit Little Creek Ranch, and see for yourself just what is being done there—you're more than welcome at any time.

If you are interested to know too, about the hay rides they have the riding instructions for children and 'teen agers, the trail rides and the horse shows, you are welcome. There are held several times a week, and you can see the near the guitar players they have there at the ranch—real Western music as you like to hear it. Visitors are always welcome, so stop in soon.
