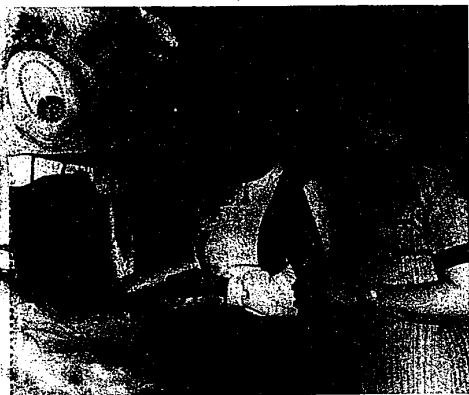


# Directory Wins JC Award

A directory of community organizations compiled by the Farmington Area Jaycee Auxiliary won the organization first place among auxiliary projects in Jaycee District 22.

The award was announced during the district's spring meeting that was hosted by the Novi Jaycee Auxiliary in the Farmington Holiday Inn April 20.

Also during the meeting Kathy Crawford of Novi was elected vice president of District 22 and Marilyn Wolcott was named outstanding Sparkette for the year. A Sparkette is a Jaycee Auxiliary member of more than a year's standing.

AN ARTS AND CRAFTS demonstration by television's Carol Duvall and a puppet show titled "The Learning Tree" also was part of the program.

The show has been developed by Macomb County Jaycees to use in grade schools and show children the dangers of drugs, pills, matches and smoking.

District 22, comprising Birmingham, Milford, Southfield, South Lyon and Walled Lake in addition to Farmington and Novi, gave the project prize to the Farmington auxiliary for a 31-page comprehensive booklet.

For each organization there is a statement of its purpose and services rendered as well as meeting place and time and president's name and telephone number.

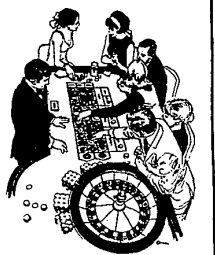
All mothers interested in the center are invited, said Mrs. Cathie Walker, director.
