**Medical Mission**

The Unitarian service committee operates hospitals, clinics, rest homes and other facilities, at strategic points throughout Europe. As a result a medical mission plan took form. A European country must ask, through its leading medical practitioners, teachers and public health officials for the assistance of a mission. The service committee organizes a "team" of American experts in the various medical specialties of immediate interest to that country. Expenses are paid by the service committee out of private contributions. The team appears in that country's leading medical schools and in meetings of practitioners to describe, discuss, display and demonstrate its new tools, techniques and treatments.

**Painting Radiators**
