

BERLIN, GERMANY — About 10,000 red members of the S.E.D. party, singing the Internationale and waving red banners, broke down the doors and stormed into Berlin City Hall. Shouting defiance of the Western Powers, they demand control of the city.

### SEVEN FARMINGTON STUDENTS ENROLL AT U. OF M.

Seven students from the Farmington Area will be represented in the Freshman Class this fall at the University of Michigan. Registrar Ira M. Smith announced this week. Entering the College of Literature, Science and the Arts from Farmington High School are: Ed. Bridge Dunckel, 28225 Farmington Road; Carolyn Marie Early, 30435 Ten Mile Road; Patricia Beverly, 28325 Michigan Road and John Stanton Pettibone, 33755 Macomb Street.

Entering the College of Literature, Science and the Arts from Charoneville High School is: Marie Francis Bousquet, 29213 Rensselaer Avenue.

Entering the College of Engineering from Farmington High will be Harvey Lea Barnes, Jr., of 21013 Ontario.

Entering the College of Architecture and Design from Farmington High School is Janet Helen Louys, 33221 Oakland Road.

A full week of Orientation activities has been planned for the freshmen, beginning September 13. This period will include the registration days for all students, September 15-18.

In addition to consulting with faculty counselors about courses of study and to registering for their classes, the incoming freshmen will be given health examinations, hearing and speech tests, and a series of special aptitude and achievement tests. Results will be used as a basis for continuing health care of the students and for academic guidance throughout their stay at the University.

On the "social side", the freshmen will also get a complete introduction to the campus. On the first night of Orientation Week, all will assemble in Hill Auditorium for a welcome from University President Alexander G. Rutven and other University officials. On other nights during the week, they will meet student leaders at the Michigan Union and Michigan League and in their residence halls.

They will also be invited to open house programs at churches near the campus.

Bulk of the freshmen will be enrolled in the College of Literature, Science and the Arts or in the College of Engineering, which are the largest undergraduate divisions of the University. Freshmen will also enroll, however, in the School of Forestry and Conservation, School of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, and School of Education. The School of Dentistry will admit freshmen in its special program in dental hygiene.
