The contest is to aid in the promotion of Michigan Apples in the state and nation.

Persons entering the contest may furnish only one pie. Each pie should have an overall diameter of about 9½ inches. The pie should be baked when submitted to the judges. Each pie should be marked with a 3x5 card containing the name and address of the contestant. The card should be placed on the bottom of the pie tin with scotch tape after the pie is cool. Each contestant must submit to the judges a copy of the recipe. Dunkel requested that all pies to be entered in the contest be at the Town Hall by 1:30 p.m. Thursday, September 2.

Judging will be on the following basis: 20 per cent for appearance, 40 per cent for crust and 40 per cent for filling. The pies must be two-crust, open or lattice pie not eligible.
