Minutes of the regular meeting held August 11th, 1948, were read and approved.

Motion made by Johnson and supported by Miller that the bills presented to the Commission for the month of August, 1948, be paid. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Loomis and supported by Otis that Mrs. E. V. Ayres be appointed to serve on the Farmington Township and City Library Board to fill the vacancy. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Otis and supported by Bagnall that H. D. Tupper be reappointed as a member of the Board of Appeals for a term of three years from September 12th, 1948 to September 12, 1951, and that Glenn H. Leland be appointed as a member of the Board of Appeals for a term of three years from September 12th, 1948 to September 12, 1951, to fill the vacancy left by Paul R. Schreiber. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Miller that \$2400.00 be transferred from the new water main account to the Street Repair account. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Loomis and supported by Johnson that BE IT RESOLVED by this Commission that the Michigan State Highway Department be requested to limit the speed on East Bound Highway No. 13, known as Grand River Avenue Cut-Off from Gill Road to Nine Mile Road to 45 miles per hour, with the exception of the approach to the intersection of Farmington Road and Grand River Avenue Cut-Off which should be limited to 25 miles per hour for a distance of 300 feet from said intersection. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Michigan State Highway Department be requested to erect suitable road signs designating the aforesaid speed limitations and that proper intersection warning signs be erected. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Otis and supported by Bagnall that the contract for construction of sewers and installation of catch basins as outlined by Mr. L. N. Hayden be awarded to Morris Mickelson Company, 21470 Coolidge Highway, Detroit, Michigan, the lowest bidder, subject however to the approval of City Engineer, Mr. L. N. Hayden. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Otis that \$500.00 be transferred from the sidewalk repair account to the sewer repair account. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Hatton and supported by Johnson that Commissioner Miller be authorized to hire the Electric Paint and Varnish Company to repair the roof on the City Hall at cost of \$123.85. Roll Call - Loomis, Johnson, Otis, Bagnall, Miller, Hatton. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Johnson and supported by Bagnall that the bill of the Detroit Concrete Products Company in the amount of \$5,118.73 for street repairs be paid. Roll Call - Miller, Bagnall, Johnson, Otis, Loomis, Hatton. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Loomis and supported by Bagnall that Commissioner Hatton be granted permission to purchase equipment for the Public Works Department from the Contractors Machinery Company, 333 Midland Avenue, Detroit 3, Michigan, at a price not to exceed \$4300.00. Roll call - Loomis, Johnson, Otis, Bagnall, Miller, Hatton. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Johnson and supported by Loomis that the meeting be adjourned. Carried, all yeas.
