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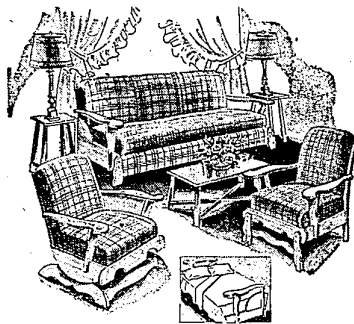

Also of interest to younger members of the congregation, is the formation of a new choir. Children interested should be at the church on Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m.

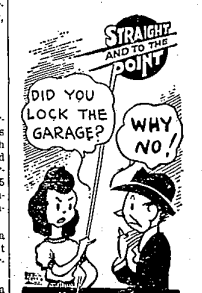
Driver's Licenses

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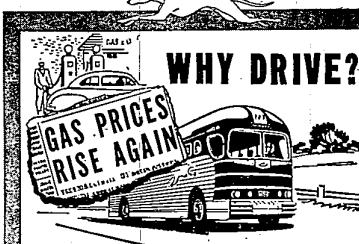
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
