## Signs of Cocciidiosis

Chicks affected with cocciidiosis become droopy, let their wings sag, and lag behind the rest of the flock. Beaks and shanks are pale. Infected chicks eat little and so become thin, and often die in a few days. In chronic cocciidiosis, chicks grow slowly and usually are poor feathered, pale and thin. In older birds, the combs are blue and the birds are inactive.
