SOIL CONSERVATION PLAN ANNOUNCED BY AAA COMMITTEE

Oakland County farmers who participate in the 1949 Agricultural Conservation Program will be given credit under the program for incorporating into the soil as green manure crops good stands of winter wheat or winter rye, according to Walter Cook, chairman of the Oakland County AAA Committee.
During the war when the demand for grain was so great this practice was discontinued as a conservation measure, Mr. Cook said. However, it will be made available to farmers again in next year's program because the demand for grain is less and the need for rebuilding the soil after heavy wartime production is urgent.

In any Township or City in which the Clerk does not maintain regular daily office hours, the Township Board or legislative body of such Township or City may designate that the Clerk be at his office or other designated place for the purpose of receiving applications for registration, on such other days as it shall designate prior to the last day for registration, not exceeding five days in all.
