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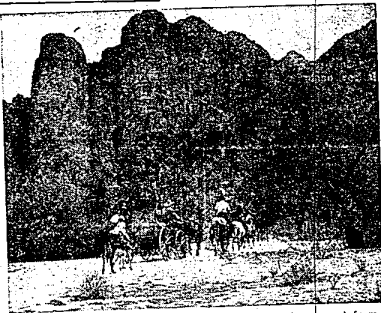

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## Vacation Highlights by The Old AAA Traveler



"Land of the Sun" the poetically inclined call Arizona, and from now until late spring that section will attract thousands who love the thrill of mountain and desert and valley — and chuck wagon suppers out on the trail.

Down Arizona way the Navajo and Hopis and Paches are smiling wide smiles, and brown little Indians are chattering away for dear life. Vivid rugs and blankets are being brought to town and on display in those turquoise to give Woodward Avenue.

That's because the Southwest is about to be filled with sun-worshippers and the Indian's pockets are about to be filled with vacationists' money.

And rightly so, my friends, for that Land of the Sun, that Arizona and New Mexico and eastward to Texas is truly the heart's desire of a winter vacation playplace. It's a land filled to the very brim with color and romance and legend, peopled with fantastically picturesque individuals, and, above all, with a climate that makes you glad you're alive, doubly glad that you're able to get away from chill winds and icy streets, and triply glad that section in America have a spot so beautiful you find yourself wondering if maybe you aren't just dreaming it.

Yes, wherever you go in Arizona or New Mexico you are in a land of enchantment. Indians, of course, are tops in interest with we Americans, for since childhood we have had the red man's picturesque qualities drilled into us. It is in Arizona and New Mexico that you see the Navajo women weaving blankets and rugs so typical of that section, and it is only the Navajo medicine man who is permitted to make the magnificent sand paintings.

In those sand paintings you will see vivid powders made from crushed rock used as artists would use his paints in creating the ceremonially significant designs in the sand, and if you watch you will notice that no sand painting is permitted to remain intact after sundown.

It is in this section of the glorious southwest that you see the ancient cliff dwellings — the famed Seven Cities of Cibola. It is in this section that you will see the remaining Apaches, once the most warlike of all American Indians, and if you have time it is probable you will travel the 80 miles of magnificent Apache Trail between Globe and Phoenix, to my way of thinking the most impressive stretch of highway in the world.

But let's see what we might see on an average swing into Arizona and New Mexico. It is probable we'd enter New Mexico through Blanton Pass, 7300 feet up, as we travel southward out of Denver, and, once through that pass, you are in the fairland you have been seeking. Santa Fe and Albuquerque, Gallup and Chaco Canyon, and then across the line into Arizona, with its Winslow and Flagstaff and the swing northward for a looksee at Grand Canyon and Kaibab Forest. You'll probably head south into

Prescott and on down to Phoenix. It is just east of Phoenix that we pick up Arizona State Route 88, the Superstition Mountains into Globe and Miami. It might be, however, that time would make it possible for us to swing southward out of Phoenix for a glimpse of Tucson and, of course, a day in Tombstone, for once you have seen it, you will agree with me that that gray little ghost town is America's most thrilling single spot.

Volumes could be written on Tombstone, but here suffice to advise you to stroll old Allen Street, the ancient Bird Cage Theatre and Oriental Saloon and the ancient corral and — don't miss this! — Boot Hill, the cemetery in which sleep only those who died with their boots on.

You won't need much imagination to people that ancient town with characters out of the past — Wyatt Earp and Tex Howard, Mike Moon and China Mary, "Doc" Holliday and "Curly Bill" Brodus, all braves who helped make Tombstone the toughest town in the world back in the '80's.

But we can't spend too much time in Tombstone, for there must be the eastward swing to Las Cruces, down into El Paso, in the edge of Texas, and one to Carlsbad Caverns, for those cavejays today rank high among America's wonders.
