Business Hit More By Inflation Rise Than Housewives

The wholesale price index reflects the cost of materials for turning out goods in factories just as the Consumers' Price Index reflects the cost of food for the household. Men who worry about business budgets and housewives who worry about household budgets are in the same boat.

The fact is that while the Consumers' Price Index is now about 75 per cent above the prewar level, the government's wholesale commodity price is about 115 per cent above the prewar base.

DOLLAR VALUES OFF

These facts make it plain that high cost of living for business has increased as well as high cost of living for individuals. The dollar has shrunk, whether it be the wage dollar earned by the worker or the profit dollar earned by the industry.

If a manufacturer finds it necessary to expand his plant, he runs into construction costs easily double the 1939 level. The wages of construction labor have doubled and more. Wholesale prices of construction materials have gone far up. Wholesale prices of building materials in general are now more than double the 1939 average.

BILLIONS BORROWED

Business borrowed billions to finance current expansion, along with the use of whatever profits could be retained after payment of moderate dividends. This borrowing has run up total interest charges that manufacturers have to pay.

FORAGE CROPS AID IN GOOD FARMING EXPERT POINTS OUT

The hay shortage which plagued dairy farmers in Wisconsin, Minnesota, and parts of Michigan's Upper Peninsula due to dry weather have shown more than ever the importance of forage crops in livestock production. Karl A. Verry, farm management specialist at Michigan State College, says:

"Year in and year out, most Michigan farms are especially well adapted to the growing of forage crops or grasses better than any other crop for livestock feeding." Very pointed out: "Economic production depends on good forage crops, since it is estimated that feed represents about 50 per cent of the cost of producing milk, 75 per cent of the cost of eggs, and 80 to 85 per cent of the cost of beef, lamb and pork.

"Good forage is an important part of the farm program and should be well planned to furnish sufficient amounts of good quality feed for livestock."

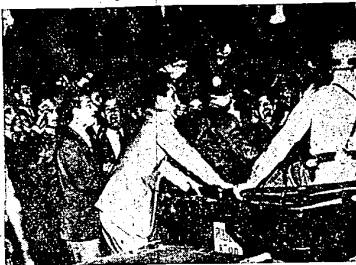

Disabled And Over-Aged Get Help In Job Hunting

A nation-wide campaign to promote more employment opportunities for over-aged and disabled workers has been jointly initiated by the National Association of Manufacturers and the U. S. Chamber of Commerce.

The two organizations, representing employers of the majority of all gainfully employed workers in the United States, are pledged to "do everything in their power" to create job opportunities for mid-aged and physically handicapped persons who are able and willing to work. Businessmen will be called upon to open up employment to elderly people whose experience often "more than makes up for some of the bounce that the years have taken out of them."

VETERANS' RECORD CITED

The success with which handicapped veterans have been induced to jobs in industry proves that the physically disabled can be useful, productive, and happy workers, it was said. Industry and business will be urged to increase support of a continuing and parallel campaign to aid the re-employment of disabled veterans.

The industrial relations and research staff of both employers' organizations will help map an effective program. Business managers are expected to proffer assistance.

OLDER WORKERS EAGER

Severals of letters in recent months from "skilled and eager, but idle workers—frustrated, discouraged men with families to house, feed, and clothe—whose only fault is that they have passed the 40- or 50-year mark," have been received by the NAM, it was announced.

COAT OF CHEMICALS SAVES SEEDS SOWN IN WET OR DRY SOIL

Seeds coated with a preparation made by manufacturers of chemicals can be planted two weeks earlier and produce better crops at less cost.

The chemicals protect the seeds from cold, wet, and drought, and also act as a counter-agent against weed-killers.

SEEDS ENLARGED
Companies selling treated seeds say the chemicals enlarged plant seed varieties so they can be planted one at a time. When lettuce seed was made into pellets by coating it with chemicals, a grower saved \$3 to \$12 an acre by planting seeds so far apart that little thinning was necessary.

It may be possible to coat seeds with chemicals distasteful to crows and rodents. If it works on tomatoes, it may enable growers to sow by drill instead of setting out plants.

Sudan Grass
Sudan grass makes good quality hay. It can also be pastured, if properly managed, to avoid losses from prussic acid poisoning. This means letting the Sudan get at least a foot high before turning the cows onto it and stopping grazing after the first frost.

Citric acid, which gives lemons and oranges their sourness, also is present in cranberries, currants, strawberries, raspberries and many other fruits.

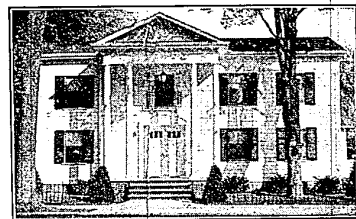

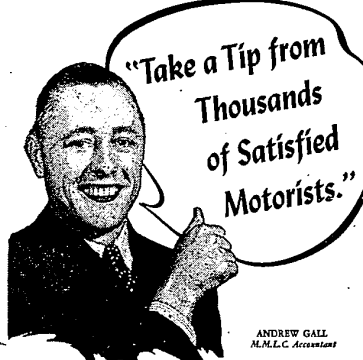
