SPOT CHECK SHOWS HUNTERS FINDING MORE PHEASANTS

The spot-polling of down-state small game hunters covering the first days of the current season indicates low gun pressure and slightly more pheasants according to the conservation department.

Biology students from the University of Michigan and Michigan State college, guided by conservation officers in their checking, found that 59 per cent of the first 61 hunters contacted believed there were more pheasants this season. Twenty-seven per cent told the future game managers that the number of birds approximated that of last year, while 14 per cent felt that there were less than before.

Part of the current difficulty experienced by pheasant hunters is attributed to dry weather. With colder days in prospect, sportsmen anticipate better work by dogs.

Conservation officers said hunters were quite responsive to the polling. The survey will continue through the final week end of the season.

Short Measure Disclosed In Anti-Freeze Containers

Miles A. Nelson, chief of the market and Enforcement bureau of the Michigan Department of Agriculture, reports that inspectors of his department have found drastic shortages in many containers of anti-freeze fluid — some, he said, amounting to as much as a pint short of the amount specified on the containers.

Some checking done in the large

or distributing centers has disclosed that only approximately one-third of the "gallon" containers actually contained full measure.

Samples of anti-freeze products offered for sale, he said, are checked by the department by first weighing the container and contents, then determining the contents by liquid measure.
