Meadowlark is truly an American bird, and in varying forms ranges throughout the United States. None of his kind is found outside the western hemisphere, and like the wild turkey, he is strictly a species of our own country. During the last 30 years the population of this merry dweller of the open fields has shown a marked decline. At one time their numbers perched exceeded that of any other species that lived outside the woodlands. The meadowlark's nest is placed on the ground under a tussock of grass. It is constructed of small stems and grasses. Usually from four to seven white eggs, highly spotted with purple and brown are laid.

Strawberry Growers Warned Of Plant Blight

For a number of years inspectors from the Bureau of Plant Industry, Michigan Department of Agriculture, have been observing a yellow appearance occurring in certain strawberry plants, especially in the Blakemore variety, reports C. A. Boyer, Chief.

Twenty years ago this peculiar condition was described as a stem-girdler which apparently caused commercial damage in some areas of the United States. The full extent of the yellowing infection has not yet been determined. However, a recent survey by government officials revealed that yellow or Xanthosis as it is now known, is a virus disease of strawberries found in many parts of the Eastern United States and the Pacific Northwest where the Marshall variety has been found to be especially susceptible.

The spread of this strawberry yellows from diseased to healthy plants is contingent upon the white strawberry aphid, and for this reason purchasers of strawberry plants should be extra careful to purchase plants free of this disease.

Michigan is one of the leading states in the production of strawberries, both fresh fruit and plants, ranking third (among other late-producing states) in the production of strawberries in 1946. It behooves every grower to be particularly alert to protect the industry from introduction of diseases or destructive insects.

Michigan's biggest winter agricultural event — Farmers' Week — is set for January 24 to 28 on the Michigan State College campus in East Lansing. Record crowds are expected again this year.
