Stop in and look over the pile of it and if you're gonna need some better grab it off. There ain't too much around you know. We're also havin' a tough time gettin' enuf walnuts, pecans and Brazil nuts to keep you happy so we'd suggest you don't delay too long in gettin' your supply fer the holidays stashed away. Don't say we didn't warn you cause we did.

Bacon and eggs — the good ole American breakfast, but you gotta go a long ways before you git better bacon than Conroy's own hickory smoked stuff. The smoke house is goin' full fast and there'll be some out early Friday aym. You can buy it by the piece or in a chunk fer 69c a lb. If any of you local farmers have any pork you want smoked bring it in and we'll fix it up. Buy some of ours and see what a swell job we do. Then we have local eggs to go with this bacon fer 69c a dozen. Eggs — sounds like another of Sams Super-special Sales. Taint so tho — it's only us tryin' to keep your cost-of-livin' down. How we doin'???
