Early Chick Orders Urged For Farmers

If you're keeping poultry just for the noise they make at day-break to wake you up, it does not matter. But if you keep the hens to earn you a little money, Howard Zindel, poultry specialist at Michigan State College, has a word of advice for you.

The highest egg prices are July to November. Early hatched chicks mean early producing pullets. Remember, Zindel warns, that it takes an average of about six months from hatching time for pullets to get into production.

January hatched chicks start producing in July when the egg prices start up. May hatched chicks are ready to lay just as prices start down. Zindel suggests you place orders now for your early hatched chicks and prepare to cash in on high egg prices next summer.

Instructions Given For Shipping Bugs

If you've ever tried to put a mashed bug back together again, you'll know the problem that sometimes faces the entomologists at Michigan State College.

When people send insects to East Lansing for identification, they are often received in such a condition that it is almost impossible to recognize them. Word recently received from the entomologist by Kirt D. Bailey, county entomological agent, gives some of the do's and don'ts for submitting insect samples.

Insects mailed in envelopes, whether alive or dead, are sure to be crushed, they say. When sent alive in boxes, they may either get their way out or the box becomes broken and they escape.

To insure good results in forwarding insects to the Michigan State College entomology department to find out what they are and how to treat them, agent Bailey gives these directions:

1. Collect a half dozen or more of the insects to be identified.

2. Kill the insects by placing them in rubbing alcohol. Other liquids are often used in such a condition that it is almost impossible to recognize them.

3. Place the insects between soft tissue to fill the box is ideal.

4. Include your name and address.

Following this procedure will help the entomologists to make an identification of the insects you may send in.

Hi-Him Drivers Escaping detection is becoming an increasingly difficult task for hi-and-nu motorists due to improved police methods. One new device is a stroboscopic camera that can tell more than 2,000,000 colors apart so that a speck of automobile paint, found at the accident scene, can be compared with paint on various makes and models as an aid in finding the car involved. In addition, a photograph of the marks generally enables police to learn the make and size of tire.
