### HOOVER REPORT ON ORGANIZATION FOR SALE TO PUBLIC

The reports of the Hoover Commission on the organization of the executive branch of the Government will be made available to the public in printed form, the Government Frinting Office annunced today. Advance subscriptions of \$10.09 are now being accepted by the Superintendent of Office, Washington 25. D. G. The total number of publications has not been definitely determined, but forty to fifty documents are tentatively planned and will be issued at Irregular intervals early in 1949. Because of the widespread interest in the reports of the Hoover Commission, the Superintendent of Documents established the advance subscription plans so that interested

The documents will include the reports and recommendations of the Hooyer Commission and also the 'task force' studies.
