FLOWERS HAVE been a part of weddings for centuries. They are treasured for the beauty, color and wealth of tradition which they bring to marriage ceremonies of every size and description. WEDDING BOUQUETS

A bouquet of flowers is traditionally carried by the bride and each of her attendants at all but the most informal weddings. It may be anything from a large armload of flowers to a small nosegay, but it should be scaled to the size of the girl and complementary to the style of her dress. A loose cascade of feathered chrysanthemums, for example, might be stunning for a tall bride in a long flowing gown, but overpowering to a short girl in a simple sheath. A delicate arrangement of violets is charming in a flower girl's basket, but it might look foolish in the hands of a bridesmaid wearing a stately velvet gown.

THE BRIDE'S bouquet is traditionally made of white flowers mixed with ivy (the symbol of fidelity) or other greens. White roses, orchids, carnations, stephanotis, lilies of the valley and gardenias_are the favorite bridal' flowers, but many others are used in season. Easter lilies, for example,
