Conservation Dept. To Use Two-Way Radio

A radio transmitter with a 30-foot mast has been completed and placed atop the state office building in Lansing providing the conservation department with an enlarged communications system.

Messages originating in Lansing will go to the automatic repeater station at Stanton in Montcalm County. The Stanton station will rebroadcast them to regional and district offices throughout the state. Two-way car communication also will be possible with the new system.

Full scale operation will begin as soon as the Federal Communications Commission allows the department its own wave length.

Ice fishermen in shanties set up just off bathing beaches in state parks and elsewhere are being asked by the conservation department to prevent bottles and other trash from getting into the lakes. Debris can wash up on the beaches in the spring and glass and cans especially may become a hazard to bathers in the summer.

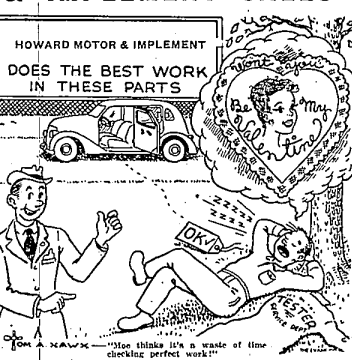
