

Special Election

(Continued from Page One) eligible to vote in the special election. In an open letter the Board of Education explains the problem involved in the special election and the reason for the request for authority to transfer the funds.

The letter follows: "We now have sufficient moneys in the 1941 and 1944 Debt Funds to pay off all indebtedness on the Central School and the High School. In addition to this we now have approximately \$11,000.00 of surplus moneys in these funds."

"When the Board of Education received authority from the voters to spread taxes to pay off the bonds, the State Debt Commission at Lansing compelled the Board of Education to spread sufficient taxes to assure enough moneys each year to meet the yearly payments. They based this amount on the average percentage of collections of the preceding five years. In our case this was about 70 per cent."

"During the past few years the increase in building in the School District and the higher assessments on property have enabled us to raise more than sufficient moneys to pay off these debts."

"There will be no more taxes assessed against property for these two debts but as delinquent taxes are paid by those who for some reason did not pay their taxes promptly, there will be a surplus of moneys in these funds and accounts."

"It is this money, both that on hand and that which is still to be paid, which you are being asked to transfer to the Building and Site Fund. The present sewage disposal system at the High School does not meet with the approval of the Health Department and must be replaced and enlarged."

"If these funds are not transferred and made available they can not be used for anything and the above mentioned expenses must then be met out of General Fund moneys which will decrease the amount of money available to operate the Schools."

Summers Here Fer Sure!

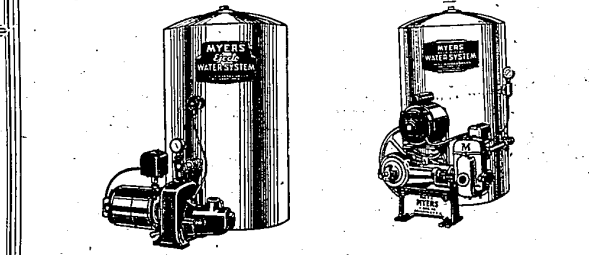
