### Order Oil Cut-Back In Arenac County

A cutback in oil production in the Deep River field in Arenac county to 60 barrels daily per well is ordered by state supervisor of wells P. J. Hoffmaster, effective May 2. Previous allowable daily production per well was 80 barrels.

The order followed a public hearing and meeting of the Oil Advisory Board Friday afternoon.

Daily production per well in the recently opened Isabella field in Isabella county was set at 85 barrels. After hearing evidence, it was decided to take no action to fix allowable production in the Mears field in Oceana county.
