for Annual School District Election To Be Held On Monday, June 13, 1949

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to an order of the Board of Education of the Farmington Township School District of Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, that the registration of the qualified electors of said District will take place on May 10, 1949 to June 4, 1949, both inclusive, and at the times and places indicated below:

TAKE NOTICE — Those qualified electors who have previously registered in this school district need not reregister for this election.

THE LAST DAY OF REGISTRATION SHALL BE SATURDAY, JUNE 4, 1949

REGISTRATION BY AFFIDAVIT

Any absent voter whose name is not registered shall offer and claim the right to vote at by Absent Voter's Ballot at any Election or Special Election, may at the time of making application for Absent Voter's Ballot, present to the Secretary of the Board of Election, an affidavit for registration which is worded in proper form.

REGISTRATION OF ABSENTEE BY OATH

If any person whose name is not registered shall offer and claim the right to vote at any Annual Election or Special Election, and shall, UNDER OATH, state that he is a resident of such Precinct and has resided in the SCHOOL DISTRICT the required length of time preceding such Election, designating from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 4, 1949, the place at which he desires to register, he was unable to make application for registration on the last two days provided by law for the registering of electors preceding such election, then the name of such person shall be registered, and he shall be permitted to vote at such election. If such applicant shall, in said matter, willfully make any false statement, he shall be deemed guilty of perjury.
