Little License Plates Send
Lost Keys Back To Owners

The Disabled American Veterans has returned a set of lost keys to Selma H. Whitehead, 32300 Grand River, Farmington.

Attached to the keys was a DAV Identity-Tag, miniature license tag for key rings, which is distributed to 30,000,000 motorists each year.

The replica of their state license plates enables the DAV to return 5,000 keys a month from its national headquarters in Cincinnati.

Keys are returned to owners from all over the world. Only the most unusual key losses and returns are a Cincinnati grainery employee lose his set in a sack of grain.

The keys were found aboard a freighter in the English Channel enroute to Poland and they made their way back via the DAV.

Tags even brought back keys from the war zones.


