It is given cadets who exhibit outstanding qualities of leadership and knowledge in the field of aerospace education.

Trout, 18, is the son of Lt. and Mrs. George Trout, 33640 Brittany Hill, and a member of the Walled Lake Civil Air Patrol Squadron.

He presently is a Pvt. 4C at Virginia Military Institute, Lexington, Va. He has received three nominations to the Air Force Academy and expects to enter there this July.

Miss Hullm Is Awarded Scholarship

FARMINGTON Tracey W. Hullm, Harrison High School senior, has been awarded a \$1,500 S.S. Kresge Co. achievement scholarship.

The award was one of only 18 in Michigan and 225 in the United States granted through the National Achievement Scholarship Program for outstanding Negro students.
