

# Water Rate Curbs Asked

A public hearing on a bill to place public water systems under the jurisdiction of the Michigan Public Service Commission is slated for April 2 in Veterans' Memorial Building, 151 W. Jefferson, Detroit.

The hearing will begin at 10 a.m. in the Polar Bear Room.

Sen. William Faust (D-Westland) urged suburbanites who are irked by their lack of control over Detroit water rates to attend the hearing. Faust is a co-sponsor of the bill.

"In the past, the Detroit Water Board has been able to increase water rates for surrounding communities without any public hearing because the system is not under the jurisdiction of the commission," Faust said.

"Until this proposal is approved by the Legislature, residents of the surrounding communities will never really have any control over water rates."

# Nutritionist Due At Schoolcraft

Adelle Davis, the 68-year-old California housewife Time Magazine calls "the high priestess of nutrition," will speak at Schoolcraft College on Tuesday, April 3, at 8 p.m. in the Waterman Campus Center.

Her lecture is sponsored by the college's cultural and public affairs committee, which reports the largest advance ticket sale of the season for her appearance.

General admission is \$2 and tickets are available at the bookstore on campus, open until 7 p.m. Monday, Thursday, and until 3 on Friday afternoons.

Schoolcraft is located at 18600 Haggerty, between Six and Seven Mile Roads, Livonia.

6 Vitamins Daily

A best-selling author who holds a master's degree in biochemistry, Miss Davis contends that malnutrition is at the root of most of America's health, emotional and social problems.

Her four books, "Let's Eat Right To Keep Fit," "Let's Keep Well," "Let's Cook It Right," and "Let's Have Healthy Children" have sold more than seven million copies.

One of the earliest supporters of the natural food movement, Miss Davis follows a diet of fruit, home-grown vegetables, raw milk, eggs and cheese. She also fortifies her diet by taking no fewer than six vitamins and supplements after each meal.

She takes vitamin C for stress, and recommends vitamins to avoid a wide variety of diseases and conditions, including diabetes, heart disease and some cancers.

Miss Davis is not without her critics. According to Time, many scientists and academicians find her message heretical. They report that the Chicago Nutrition Association includes three of her books on its list of works that are not recommended.

Reportedly, Dr. Edward H. Rynearson, professor emeritus of the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine, University of Minnesota, has conducted a careful study of her books and claims to have found hundreds of errors of fact and interpretation.

# Financial Aid Deadline Near

Students wishing to receive financial aid in order to attend Schoolcraft College next fall are reminded that April 15 is the deadline date for applications.

Keith Wilmer, Schoolcraft's director of financial aid and placement, said that both new and renewal applications are due by that date. His office provides loans, outright grants and work-study opportunities for approximately 350 students each year.

"While the federal government hasn't notified us of the amounts or kinds of programs they will fund in the 1973-74 academic year," Wilmer said, "it would appear that we will be able to offer programs similar to past years."

Expenditures for financial aid at Schoolcraft during 1972-73 totaled nearly \$350,000.

# House To List Votes Taken In Committee

State Rep. John Marks (D-Westland) was one of three legislators on the House policy committee to initiate a new policy requiring committee votes to be recorded in the daily journals of the house.

Journals will list committee votes on bills, joint resolutions and reorganization orders making the votes more readily available to the public.

Legislators have voted one way in committee and another way on the House floor. This action would make both votes public.

Marks, who is Democratic vice chairman of the committee, initiated the action along with Rep. James E. O'Neil (D-Saginaw), committee chairman, and Rep. Roy L. Spencer (R-Attica), Republican vice chairman.

They petitioned House Speaker William Ryan (D-Detroit) to develop procedures.
