ed in the Oakland County area during the campaign remain with the local chapter for use. The remainder goes to the National American Red Cross for outside services. A few of the local Red Cross chapters are Junior Red Cross, safety services, home nursing, services to veterans, volunteer activities and emergency preparedness and relief. The national program includes services to the armed forces, the national blood bank program and major disaster work. The Red Cross Drive is held annually in Farmington and throughout the nation at this time of the year. Due to policy established by the Board of Governors, the American Red Cross is continuing its individual campaign. According to the policy established appeals made in the name of the Red Cross should relate solely to objectives connected with Red Cross work. Employee solicitation and payroll deduction plans can be worked out under the policy provided that collections are made directly by the employer to the Red Cross chapter. The major reason why the Red Cross goal is higher this year is the fact that there is available ten million dollars less reserve funds to apply to the gross budget nationally, officials stated. The expansion of the National Blood Bank program is another factor in the increase.

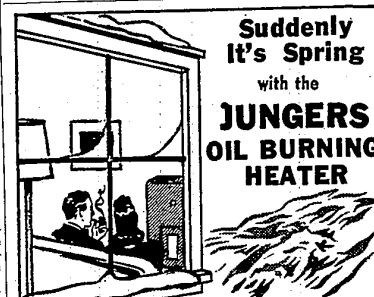

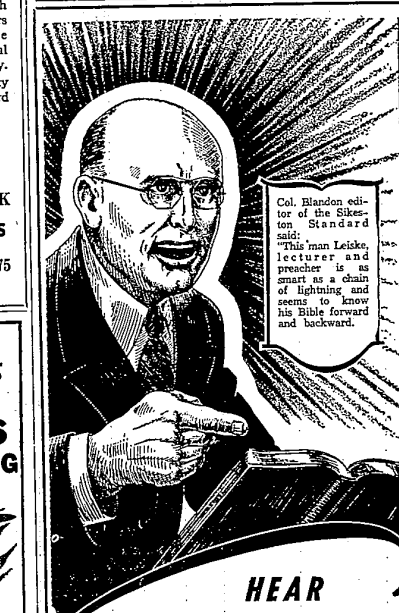
