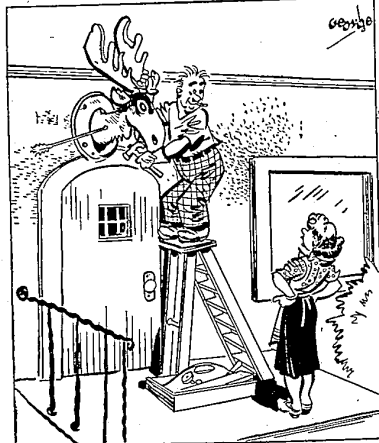

Fuchs's friends recall that he first  
worked on atomic matters in Canada,  
at the Chalk River plant in  
northern Ontario.  
According to British intelligence,  
Klaus Fuchs came to Britain from  
Germany in 1932 as an anti-Nazi  
refugee on orders from Moscow.  
Fuchs's instructions were to work  
on the atomic bomb project, and to  
pass information to the Soviet Union.  
Fuchs was a brilliant physicist and  
a member of the Manhattan Project.  
He was one of the few scientists who  
knew the exact size of the critical mass  
of the atomic bomb, and even the secret  
of the detonator.
