Reminds Farmers Of Seed Tests

Farmers who advertise their seed for sale are reminded by Charles A. Stahl, State Seed Analyst, Michigan Department of Agriculture, that it is necessary to tag this seed to comply with the Seed Law. The tag must show the commonly accepted name of the seed, approximate percentage by weight of pure seed present, percentage by weight of inert matter, approximate percentage by weight of other agricultural seeds than those required to be named on the label, the name of each kind of the seeds of the secondary noxious weeds if present in excess of the specified amount in the Seed Law. No seed may be sold if it contains the primary noxious weed seeds. The tag must also show the approximate percentage of germination and if it is the seed of red clover, alfalfa, soy bean or field corn, the state where grown and the name and address of the person who labeled the seed or who sells or offers the seed for sale.

The State Seed Law provides for the Seed Laboratory to that farmers and seedsmen may get their seed tested. The Seed Laboratory makes every effort to render prompt and dependable service.

Farmers should send their samples to the Seed Division, Michigan Department of Agriculture, State Office Building, Lansing, as soon as possible in order to meet the spring planting deadline.

Always try new crop and garden varieties on a small scale planting first, Michigan State College agriculturalists advise.

There is nothing in weed killers like 2,4-D that can cause trouble with livestock that graze on sprayed pastures, Michigan State College researchers report.

GRASS DAYS SCHEDULED IN EIGHT AREAS

Eight local committees, working with county agricultural agents, are making plans for Michigan's 1950 Grass Days. Continued interest in forage crop production, harvesting and utilization on the part of farmers caused these educational events to be planned for the third consecutive year. More than 50,000 attendees held during the past two years.

While many agencies cooperate, planning is done by the Michigan Cooperative Extension Service. A state committee makes arrangements for the program in general with local committees doing much to make local arrangements.

Richard Bell, farm crops extension specialist and chairman of the state committee, said the general program of the 1950 events would follow the 1949 pattern. Tours to demonstration areas will be held in the morning. A brief speaking program will be held after lunch to be followed by seedling and forage machinery demonstrations.

All events in lower Michigan will be held between June 9 and June 23. The only Grass Day in the upper peninsula will be in Chippewa County on July 7. Locations and dates of some of the 1950 events are:

"Clear The Way" Is A Good Farm Plan

For more than a century, Michigan farmers have "cleared the way" to make farming operations easier and safer. David G. Steinicke, farm safety specialist at Michigan State College, thinks it's still a good idea.

He points out that farmers removed stumps and stones from their fields before they started plowing. One even went over his field and killed the rattlesnakes. Asked if that wasn't dangerous, the farmer replied:

"I reckon so, but if I don't kill them today when I'm looking, they are apt to get me tomorrow when I'm plowing and not looking for snakes."

Keeping eyes open for hazards and removing them when we see them will prevent some of those accidents that happen "when you're not looking," Steinicke concludes.

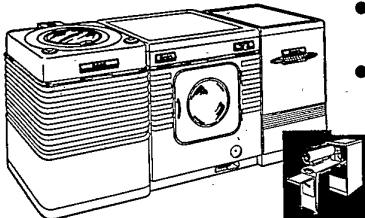
