The tag must show the commonly accepted name of the seed, approximate percentage by weight of pure seed present, percentage by weight of other agriculture. No seed may be sold if it contains the primary noxious weeds eads. The State Seed Law provides for the Seed Laboratory set that farmers and seedsmen may get their seed tested. The Seed Laboratory

Farmers should send their samp-les to the Seed Division, Michigan Department of Agriculture, Seed Office Building, Lausing, as soon as possible in order to meet the spring planting deadline.


