The Copper Country and its Keweenaw peninsula and Porcupine Mountain State Park offer grandeur on a scale that surprises even traveler.
Verily, Michigan has much, much to offer its own citizens with recreational attractions. For a beautiful peninsula, look about you!

A. C. Elmer, state park chief, reports that all 60 state parks and recreational areas will offer some combination of picnicking, fishing, swimming, camping, boating, hiking, riding stables, nature study and playgrounds. Campers will pay a daily fee of 50 cents beginning June 15. This fee is already charged in national parks.
Last year's park attendance was a record 13,000,000. More than 2,000,000 visitors concentrated in four parks — largely a matter of habit.
