Since that day I have done my best. I know in my small, humble way I have tried to make many little children smile through hours of pain. Since my husband's death, I was going to have this work to do, because it helped with my own lonely hours.

But now I find myself completely without funds to carry on. My 11 year old son has a bad heart. Things have not worked out so that the other two boys could go out west, and each day their health is no better. This past week, 17 year old Ralph had to be taken out of school because of illness.

Therefore, I do not feel it fair to my own to keep on with my beloved work. The people of Farmington have been wonderful. You have sent cards and several have gone so far as to make personal calls on the shut-ins.

I pray you'll keep it up, and perhaps some time in the near future I can return to it. Until then, God be with you all, and please write to me. And if you can find it in your hearts, please say a prayer for my six boys. (The two girls and myself seem to be coming along all right now.)
