Conservation Chief Gets New Position

Paul Hickie, state conservation department's regional chief at Jackson, resigns to accept the post of chief of all wildlife investigations on public lands for the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Headquarters will be at Denver.

No successor has yet been named to head conservation department work in the southern third of the state.

Hickie started with the department's game division in 1934 as a mammalogist and became regional chief of the department in 1945 following his return from military service. During a six-year stretch in uniform, which also included duty in New Guinea and the Philippine Islands, Hickie was appointed chief forester on General MacArthur's staff in Japan. Hickie had charge of administering the forest resources of Japan.

The 45-year old Caro, Michigan native graduated from Michigan State College in 1929 and received his master's degree in mammalogy from the University of Michigan in 1931. Prior to joining the Michigan conservation department he conducted a biological survey of Isle Royale and worked on mammal investigations in Indiana. He also was curator of the E. S. George wildlife reserve at the University of Michigan.

Joining him in Denver will be his wife Naomi and two-year-old child, Valerie.

Ticklers By George

Male sharp-tail grouse showed a 25 per cent increase over last year on Drummond Island, the conservation department's sixth census. A total of 294 sharp-tails were observed in the annual survey of island dancing grounds. Game men report more unmated males—single or small groups courting, boys in dense cover away from established grounds.

The department points out that while there was an increase in cocks over 1949, over the period of years the number of cocks has remained constant with little indication of the island colony following the cyclic trend of mainland grouse.

Nickie hunters topped the 1949 record take of ruffed grouse by nearly 100,000 birds last season. Computed take based on hunter report cards showed a bag of 570,000 ruffed grouse compared with 351,000 in 1949. Combined upper peninsula sharp-tail and prairie chicken harvest increased from 23,700 in 1949 to over 31,600 last season.
