Juveniles Admit Four Break-Ins

Police have apprehended two juveniles, both local high school students, following the fourth break-ins and entering in the area within one week. The boys, picked up by Township Officer William Edgar and State police plainclothesmen, admitted to all four of the break-ins.

Police sought the two teen agers following the breaking and entering of the E. J. Monteth home at 34437 Oakland Avenue last Thursday evening. Police said the description of two youths seen near the Monteth home tallied with a description of two boys found near the scene of two break-ins on Eight Mile Road last week.

A fourth break-in Saturday night netted the entrants eight to 10 dollars in change. The Ralph Dacey home at 31005 Lamar was the victim.

In only one break-in was an appreciable amount of goods stolen; police say entrants in one of the Eight Mile Road homes took 30 to 100 dollars in cash. They looted only a single silver dollar from the other Eight Mile Road home. Two dollars in pennies were taken from the Oakland Avenue address.

Mrs. Monteth told police she saw two boys, one fair, the other dark haired, at her home before she left it at 10:30 a.m. Thursday. She told police the boys, between the ages of 14 and 16 and both wearing striped "T" shirts, asked her for the time of day as she was leaving the house.

Another neighbor, Mrs. C. Shansour, said two boys fitting the above description stopped at her home and asked for a drink.

Entrance to the Oakland Avenue home was gained through a window. The Allen Kirkwood home at 25474 Eight Mile and the Allen McCather home at 35200 Eight Mile were entered Saturday afternoon, June 10. Entry was gained through a small window in the Kirkwood home, and through a door at the McCather home.
