### Summer Fishing Speeds Up

Michigan's most popular sport shifted to a faster pace June 25 when thousands of anglers spread to the state's 11,000 lakes for the first time this year.

The last Sunday in June, the conservation department reminds, was the start of six to nine months of bluegill, sunfish and black bass fishing throughout the state. A number of other species also became legal game pole targets in southern Michigan below Highway M-46.

Included are northern pike, walleyed pike, crappies, rock bass, yellow perch, warmouth bass, white fish, white bass and other fish which are listed in the fish law digest.

Regulations are unchanged except for a liberalization of the walleye minimum size limit from 14 to 13 inches. The daily creel limit on bluegills, sunfish, perch, rock bass, crappies and warmouth bass remains the same at 25 in any combination of which not more than 15 of the total may be bluegills. There is no minimum size limit on these species. White bass must be seven inches long, daily possession limit is ten. Whitefish of any length may be taken, maximum daily limit is seven.

For northern pike, walleyes, largemouth black bass and smallmouth black bass the daily maximum is five in any combination on inland lakes and streams. Minimum size limits are 14 inches for northern pike and 10 inches for bass species.

Frogs may be taken now. They may not be speared at night with artificial light.

The conservation department cautions the resident angler, who has yet to pick up his \$1.50 license, that he may find his favorite supply source exhausted if he waits until the last minute. A license is required for fishing in inland waters of any person who has passed his 17th birthday. Wives of resident anglers only can fish free by filling out the stub attached to the regular license. Non-resident fishermen, including wives of out-staters, may purchase a 10-day temporary license for \$2 or the annual license for \$3.

The conservation department's fish division operates 154 public fishing sites which provide boat launching space and parking facilities on many lakes and streams. Division field crews expect to have these sites cleaned and touched up in the very near future.

Michigan led the nation with the most licensed fishermen (1,110,109) in the last fiscal year.

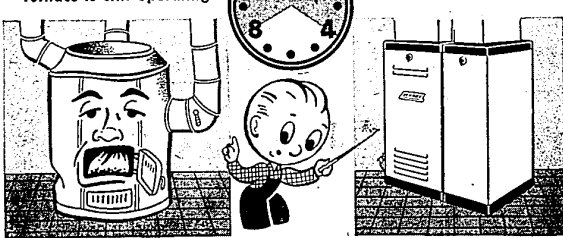
