This Friday the youngsters from the Clarenceville Recreation Commission will visit the Detroit Firemen's Training School on Warren Avenue in Detroit.

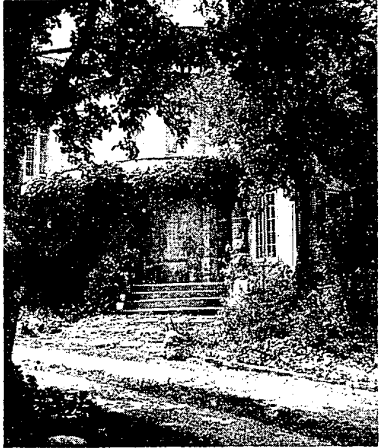

TO HOLD ECONOMIC WORKSHOP JULY 26 TO AUGUST 15

Between 75 and 100 educators and economists will take another look into some of the nation's toughest economic problems when they journey to Michigan State College July 26 to participate in the second annual Economic Workshop.

"Purpose of the workshop will be to continue the work started last year at MSC's first workshop session. 'It has a sort of one-two aim,' said Herman J. Wynnard, Dean of MSC's School of Business and Public Service.

"Firstly, businessmen, educators and economists will be getting together to discuss the best ways of teaching the man in the street fundamentals of economic and social policies," Dean Wynnard said.

A second purpose is to assist educators, especially those in the secondary schools, with developing youth to a complete understanding of economic citizenship. A number of prominent educators and economists will address the workshop this year. They include S. Morris Livingston, Chicago consulting economist; Arthur Uppgren, of the school of business administration, University of Minnesota; John K. Langum, vice-president, Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago; and J. C. Davis, member of President Truman's Council of Economic Advisors, Washington, D. C.

The Michigan Council on Economic Education, under the chairmanship of Dr. Eugene B. Elliott, and Michigan State College are joint sponsors of the workshop.

Don Westlake Saves Boy From Drowning

Don Westlake, 29223 Eight Mile Road, is a hero after saving the life of a six year old boy last week from Lake Missaukee, near Lake City, Michigan.

Billy Stacy, Okemos, Michigan, owes his life to the quick thinking and action of Don and his sister, Barbara Westlake. Don, a former Boy Scout, rescued the child from the water after he and two other children were blown out into the lake in an earless boat. Billy nearly drowned when he became frightened and jumped from the boat.

Barbara and Don, upon hearing that the children were afloat in the

boat, rowed to the spot where the children were. Don immediately dove in and dragged Billy from the water. He applied artificial respiration to the child in the boat while Barbara rowed to shore. Lake City firemen were immediately summoned with a pullmotor. According to firemen, Don's quick action had saved the boy's life. Billy had been under water several minutes before Don rescued him.
