Motion made by Commissioner Miller and supported by Commissioner Cavanaugh that bills presented for the month of June, 1950, be paid.

Motion made by Commissioner Loomis and supported by Commissioner Hatton that the Groves-Walker Post No. 316 of the American Legion be granted permission to hold their annual Gala Days from July 19, 1950, to July 23, 1950. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Commissioner Loomis and supported by Commissioner Cavanaugh that Mrs. Hazel Leland be retained as Auditor for the period from July 1, 1950 to June 30, 1951, at a salary of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars per year.

Roll Call: Hatton, Loomis, Miller and Cavanaugh. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Commissioner Cavanaugh and supported by Commissioner Miller that Section 115 -- Title C of Ordinance No. C-18 be changed as follows: and be placed on its first and second reading:

Whereas land whether platted or unplatted at the time this Ordinance becomes effective shall thereafter be surveyed, laid out, divided, subdivided or platted into streets, alleys, parks, lots or other areas, so dedicated and accepted by the City of Farmington, unless the lots upon which the intention or plan is to erect dwellings, are fifty (50) feet or more in width and six thousand five hundred twelve (6,512) square feet or more in area AND IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO ERECT ANY BUILDING ON ANY LOT, PARCEL OF LAND THAT IS NOT AT LEAST FIFTY (50) FEET IN WIDTH, WHEN THE SANITARY DRAINAGE IS CONNECTED TO AND PASSES INTO A SEPTIC TANK DISPOSAL FIELD. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Commissioner Loomis and supported by Commissioner Cavanaugh that the following resolution for a general revision of the Charter of the City of Farmington be adopted:

At a Regular Meeting of the City Commission of the City of Farmington, County of Oakland and State of Michigan, held in the Municipal Building of said City, on the twelfth day of July, A. D. 1950.

Present: Delos Hamlin, Mayor, and Commissioners Hatton, Loomis, Miller and Cavanaugh.

Commissioner Loomis moved the adoption of the following resolution and the motion for adoption was seconded and supported by Commissioner Cavanaugh.

RESOLVED that the City of Farmington, by its duly elected and qualified legislative body, declare its intent in favor of a general revision of its Charter and that the question of having a General Charter Revision shall be submitted to the electors of said City of Farmington for adoption or rejection, at the next General November Election, on Tuesday, the 7th day of November, A.D. 1950.

FISHING AND DEER LICENSES FOR 1949 REACH RECORD HIGH

Final reports for 1949 from conservation department licenses confirm previous estimates of a record-breaking high for fishing and deer hunting license sales and a new high in revenue from all hunting and fishing licenses.

The state took in a total of \$5,098,609 in 1949 for hunting and fishing license sales. Previous high revenue was \$4,985,711 in 1948.

Resident fishing licenses sold in 1949 increased to \$19,702 from the 1948 high of \$19,711 and annual non-resident fish licenses rose to \$72,145 in 1949. Fewer non-resident hunters bought deer hunting licenses, 7,122 in 1949, 8,012 in 1948. Camping permits dropped from 1,522 in 1948 to 1,322 in 1949.

The increased popularity of Robin Hood style hunting was shown in the all-time high of 11,937 bow and arrow licenses purchased by resident archers and the record 683 by non-residents. In 1948, 9,012 resident and 579 non-resident licenses were sold to bowmen.

Resident small game hunters bought 621,753 hunting licenses in 1949, more than the 552,299 sold in 1948 but less than the all-time high of 687,065 in 1946. A total of 4,031 non-resident hunting licenses were sold, 257 more than in 1948.
