

#### FISHING AND DEER LICENSES FOR 1949 REACH RECORD HIGH

Final reports for 1949 from con

Final reports for 1949 from conservation department itemse agents confirm previous estimates of a record-breaking high for fushing and deer hunting license sales and accord-breaking high for fushing and deer hunting license sales and anone of the fushing itemse.

The state took in a total of \$5.00,8,609 in 1949 for hunting and fishing license sales. Previous high revenue was \$4,985,711 in 1948. Resident fishing licenses sold in 1949 increased to \$19,702 from the 1948 high of \$97,911 and annual non-resident fish licenses rose to 137,430 from 121,745. Temporary increased from 169,498 in 1948. first year they were required, to 182,658 in 1949. Resident deer bunters bought a record 373,707 licenses in 1949 as compared to the previous high of 373,146 in 1948. Fewer non-residents bought deer hunting licenses, 1,712 in 1949, 50,12 in 1948. 
