

# Beautification Hosts Students

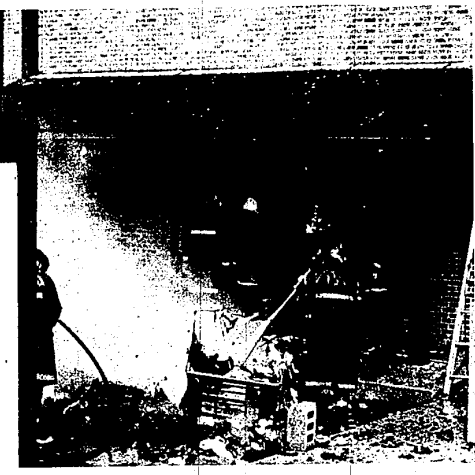
FARMINGTON ideas on environmental projects and to learn about resources available within the community which could contribute to successful environmental endeavors.

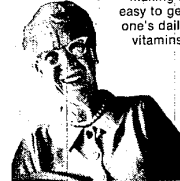
