**STUBBORN RHEE A PROBLEM**  
In the U.S.A.'s problems in bolstering Korea was a Hkale, well-meaning stubborn Korean who long lived in exile in Washington, 65-year-old President Syngman Rhee. Rhee came to the United States as a student, studied under Woodrow Wilson when he was a professor at Princeton, was so close to Wilson that he attended his wedding.

Later, as the Jap war lords tightened their grip on Korea, Rhee wanted to go home, and set up a government-in-exile in Washington. At one time Cordeau Hull intervened on his behalf when Rhee wanted to marry an American woman but could not get a passport visa. Learning of this, Secretary Hull told his passport officials to expedite the visa, thus Rhee got married.

After V.J. da S. Syngman Rhee seemed a natural to become president of Korea, and with the help of the U.S. military he was put in office. However, Rhee, then over 60, was too old, too rigid, and lived too long outside his country, was not familiar with modern Korean problems. Ambassador Muccio has had session after session with the stubborn Rhee, demanding that he create a graft, hold elections, and purge the Communists from his government. The latter had caused wholesale desertions from the Korean army, had inspired guerrilla attacks and intermittent uprisings. Finally Rhee agreed to hold elections on May 30, and on that date his party lost, probably a reason for Red invasion.

Despite Red attempts to incite revolution and anarchy speeches, the U.S. military failed to think there was any danger in Korea.  
Note — It is interesting that just two days before the Korean attack, the central intelligence agency, set up to warn the United States of military movements before they were started that not since V.J. day had the world seemed more peaceful. The Russians, CIA reported, had ceased threatening troop movements and border concentrations.

"Our highways are inadequate every day to handle the greatly increased traffic load and the 50% increase of commercial vehicles in the traffic flow.  
"We are building and maintaining roads on a 1927 tax structure, in a state that boasts of being the automobile production center of the world. It's costing the motorists of Michigan more in property damage, loss of time, injuries and attendant expenses, and increased cost of driving on inadequate roads.

"In order to stem the ever-increasing fatality rate on our highways it is necessary that additional funds be made available to correct deficiencies such as poor alignment, inadequate sight distance, improper drainage, and narrow widths on roads built 20 to 25 years ago and which are not capable of handling present day traffic safely. Highway construction programs are restricted by too little money. Highway safety cannot be built in these roads without funds. The longer we wait for adequate highway proper drainage and other safety improvements the further highways get behind, and the more of our limited funds must be spent on maintenance to preserve the highways we do have. How much longer are we going to wait and pay the high cost of waiting?"

**Rule Out Rifles For Deer In South Counties**

No rifles can be used in hunting deer in downstate counties in the open season next November 15-30 inclusive.  
The conservation commission, during its July meeting last week, turned thumbs down on a proposal to legalize the use of rifles in southern Michigan counties, restricting firearms instead of shotguns with buckshot, ball and slug loads.

All of Michigan will be open to bow and arrow hunting of male deer from October 1 to November 3 inclusive. A major portion of the state will be open to taking of deer of either sex with bows and arrows during the same period. Counties where deer of either sex may be taken during the archery season include Alcona, Alger, Antrim, Alpena, Benzie, Charlevoix, Crawford, Delta, Gogebic, Grand Traverse, Iosco, Iron, Leelanau, Lake, Luce, Mackinac, Manistow, Mason, Montmorency, Ontonagon,

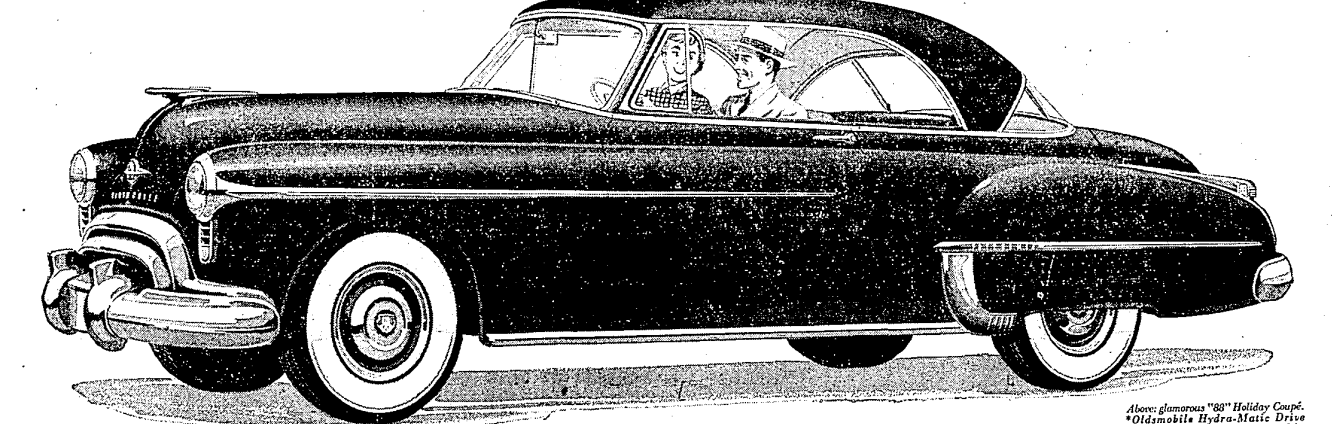
