FORESTERS STUDY MULTIFLORA ROSE FENCE VALUES

Should I plant Multiflora Rose for a fence on my farm?

That's a question coming to Michigan State College foresters since the idea for "living fences" with the new rose has become widely publicized. It has been used extensively in many areas including the south-central states.

Leslie E. Bell, forester at Michigan State College, is not ready to recommend it in Michigan — but neither does he condemn it. He wants to see how experiments being conducted in the state work out.

"Wisconsin and Minnesota experiment stations do not recommend the Multiflora Rose because of a lack of winter hardiness. Bell says.

Experimental work carried on at the Rose Lake Wildlife Experiment station near Lansing shows:

1. Rose does well on heavy, fertile soils.
2. Poor development is made on light, droughty and sandy soils.
3. Pheasants will live on rose seeds (hips) when pen fed, but prefer other foods when available.
4. Rabbits feed on young shoots.

At the Kellogg Experiment Station near Battle Creek a 15-year-old planting of Multiflora Rose froze back the ground in the winter of 1947, but has now sprouted from the roots.

Because of winter killing, its value as a permanent fence has not so far been proven in Michigan. It has been difficult to get uniform growth because of the wide difference in soil types.

Bell says farmers should go into Multiflora Rose plantings cautiously and on a limited scale in Michigan until more information is available.

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
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
