## MSC Scientist Gets Cancer Fellowship

Dr. Alfred Novak, biology professor at Michigan State College, has been awarded a special research fellowship of \$4,500 for cancer study at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena.

The fellowship, awarded by the National Cancer Institute of the U. S. Public Health Service, provides for a year's research, starting September 1.

Dr. Novak will investigate the relationship of enzymes, male sex hormones and thyroidal hormones to the fundamental problems of growth and degeneration of proteins in the human body. Since both hormones and enzymes function as builders of proteins, basic tissue material of the body, Novak said, it is hoped that such research may throw new light on the disease which today ranks as the nation's second greatest killer.

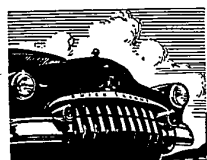
