## Sheriff Announces New Operators Test Hours

Clare L. Hubbell, Oakland County Sheriff, has announced new hours for the Operator's License Bureau at Pontiac. The office will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily, including Saturday, for renewal of licenses.

Renewals will be issued from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Wednesday only. Road tests will be given any week day from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. No road tests will be given Wednesday evenings.

The Farmington police department is issuing licenses to city residents and has been deputized by the Sheriff to issue licenses to rural and township residents.

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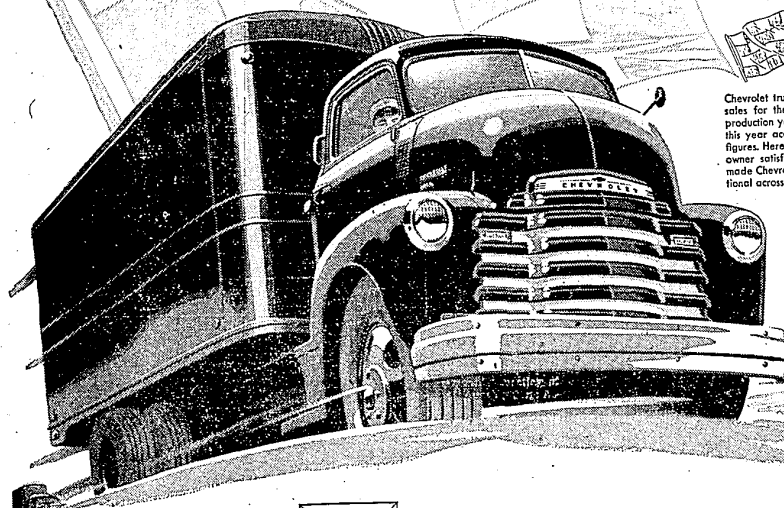


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
