Floral Park area. At present there is only one hydrant in the area. It is hoped that the job can be completed by Christmas, Miller added. Bids are also being requested for the cleaning and repainting of the city water tank. The Commission also directed the Building Commission to have the log cabin in the Town Hall park removed. They stated that the cabin is in unsafe condition. Bids were secured for some time ago for the repair of the cabin, but they were far too expensive. The cabin has not been used in several years except for storage. A group of residents from Power Avenue appeared before the Commission to request that the street be repaired. They stated that it was in very poor condition, particularly at the corner of Power and Cleveland. The Commission stated that they had expended their budget allowance for roads. They added, however, that the road would be repaired next year. The residents also requested that notice check the street for speeders. Loomis stated that the area would be patrolled.

Library Board Reports New Record Year

Mrs. A. M. Leach, Farmington librarian, and Mrs. Fred Cook, representative on the Library Board from the City, presented their annual report to the City Commission at the regular meeting last Wednesday evening. Mrs. Leach stated that the library is being used far more extensively than ever before in its history. However, the Farmington Library is not now receiving State aid due to a reduction in funds and a change in the law which now requires that the Township and City must contribute more local aid. Under the new law, local units of government must contribute 3/10 of a mill on assessed valuation in order for the library to be eligible for state aid. Members of the Commission stated that they would work out a program with the Township in order that the Farmington Library will be eligible for state aid next year. Mr. Fred Menke, Sr., treasurer of the Library Board, made the same report before the Township Board Tuesday.

MSC Plans Food Service Schools

Meeting current problems of high prices and decreasing patronage, how to figure prices for a menu, and how to merchandise your hotel, restaurant or resort operation, will be considered at events sponsored by Michigan State College this month. Two quantity food service schools will be held in the upper peninsula for any Michigan food service operator interested, announces Gladys Knight of the MSC Tourist and Resort Service. The school will run from noon of September 21 to noon of September 22, beginning, and ending with a luncheon at Webber's Resort on Lake Gogebic. Topics of the sessions will be discussed by successful food service operators and MSC staff members, including Russell Horwood, district extension supervisor for the U. P., L. R. Schoenmann, director of the MSC Conservation Institute, Miss Knight and home demonstration and county agricultural agents. Page 1 discussions, demonstrations and actually working in a kitchen will be included in the program. Program theme is "Good Food, Is Essential to Good Business."
