DRUGGIST EXPLAINS REXALL'S NEW ADVERTISING SERIES

EXPLOSIVE McKELLAR
The full story hasn't been told how 81-year-old Sen. Kenneth McKellar of Tennessee tried to buy 71-year-old Congressman Clarence Cannon of Missouri over the head with a gavel.

It happened behind closed doors, while senate and house conferees were trying to iron out differences in the appropriations bill. This brought McKellar, the senate appropriations chairman, and Cannon, the house appropriations chairman, into violent disagreement.

With an explosive snort, McKellar accused Cannon of "making slurring references." Then the aged Tennessean began spouting epithets, which an eyewitness later reported "almost peeled the paint off the walls." One of the milder terms McKellar used to describe Cannon was S. O. B. (Unabridged).

This was too much for Cannon who announced he wouldn't take such abuse "from any man" and started after McKellar. Slurping, slapping, the spattering senator from Tennessee picked up his gavel which he had been using to rap the table and tried to rap Cannon. However, colleagues separated them before they could do any damage to each other.

operation. An additional 60 men will be in training by October 1.

A refreshing note in these times of inflation: The national convention of Amvets has voted unanimously to oppose any federal bonuses "until the national economy justifies such action."

With the reports by the census bureau that large city areas have grown as much as 20 per cent faster than rural communities the old cry of reapportionment is sure to be raised in the state legislature again next year. As proposed by the League of Women Voters in 1949, reapportionment would redistrict the state, giving more representation to the cities.

Will recent wage boosts raise auto prices? Ernest R. Bosch, executive vice-president of the Ford Motor Company, says: "The impact of this action on product prices can not be clearly established now. In the long run wage factors can be financed only out of increased production."

Interesting sidelight: General Motors production this year is running 25 per cent ahead of last year's output. First eight months of this year saw 2,575,752 units manufactured.

Religion and schools—a touchy subject. Dean J. B. Edmondson of the University of Michigan recommends a compromise. The subcommittee of sectarian groups prevents promulgation of any religious course, he says. And so schools should place emphasis on moral training instead.

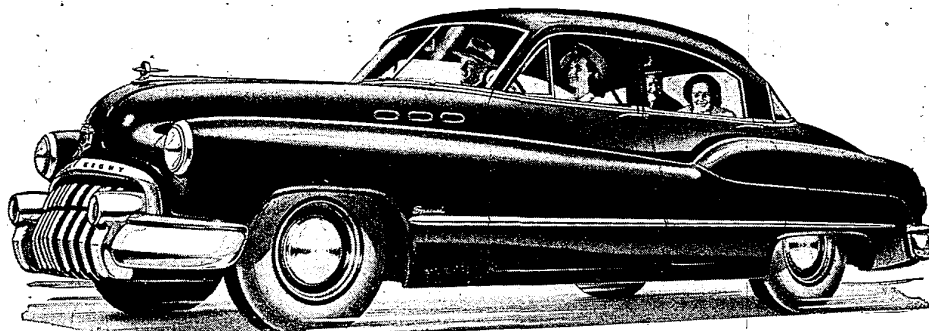
