# CYO Offers Draft Programs

Draft information booklets and high school programs are now available through the central Catholic Youth Organization Office, 305 Michigan Avenue, Detroit.

The booklets explain what a man's options are under the law and list the sources of detailed information on all facets of the law. There is a charge of \$2 per booklet.

The CYO will provide a draft information program, at no charge, to any high school interested in making this information available to its students.

"The military draft is not dead," said Ed Roberge, director of the youth leadership division of the CYO. "Dormant, yes, but it could come alive overnight."

He says that now is the time for young men to learn exactly what their options are under the present draft law. Then they will be ready to make a good choice if, despite their present expectations, they are faced with induction.

"The present draft law ends in June, but there is no guarantee this will mean the end of the draft and the end of inductions," Roberge points out.

"Much will depend, for example, upon whether there are enough volunteers to meet the needs of our armed forces. Much will depend upon whether our nation remains at peace.

"Young men are still required to register when they become 18. When they become 19, they are assigned priority numbers that are drawn in the national lottery. If it becomes necessary, draft calls could be restated in very short order.

"For that reason," he said, "I suggest that all young men should make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the draft law, deferments and exemptions. While they have time to make prudent judgments, they should choose their options. Then if the draft call is renewed, they will be able to respond in a way that will be best for them and best for their country."
