### Father Killed During War Farmington Couple Aids Two French Children Through Parents' Plan

Mr. and Mrs. Harry E. It was announced recently by "Adoption" is financial, not legal. The foster parent merely promises to contribute \$15 monthly towards the child's support for at least a year.

This is the second instance of a Farmington family adopting children through the Foster Parents' Plan. Mr. and Mrs. Louis A. Michelson of 34515 Twelve Mile Road recently "adopted" Adriana Petronella Marie Van Asten, an eleven year old Dutch girl.

After his death the widow tried to find work, but there was little available in Toulon, France, where the family lives. When she can do some cleaning in the neighborhood, but this only gives her a total income of about \$16 a month for three people.

### 1951 Fires Cost Township, City \$3,426 In Wages

Farmington City and Township firemen were paid \$3,426.00 during the entire year of 1951, according to information released by the office of Assistant City Manager James Tomnant last week.

Firemen were paid \$2,919.00 in answering alarms in Farmington Township while city fire cost taxpayers \$507.00 in wages to firemen.

Firemen are paid three dollars each for going on a call and receive a dollar and a half for each additional hour over the first hour they are fighting a fire, an office spokesman announced.

In the first quarter of 1951, January, February and March, the township paid \$969.00 in firemen's wages while the city paid \$171.00. The second quarter the township paid \$855.00 while the city paid \$27.00. For the third quarter the township paid \$795.00 and the city \$216.00. Firemen's wages cost the township \$185.00 and the city \$95.00 in the final quarter of 1951.
