DEPUTY SHERIFF BALLOU CAPTURES RABBIT DOG

A rapid dog was captured recently near 21070 Gill Road, Deputy Sheriff E. P. Ballou reported Friday. The dog, which belonged to the Kelly family of 33505 Edna Street, was suspected of biting four-year-old Michael Dowell, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Dowell, of 33551 Edna Street, two days before it was caught.

Deputy Ballou stated that after he shot the dog, he sent the head to Ann Arbor for analysis where doctors said findings indicated rabies.

Deputy Ballou is asking persons in the Edna Street and Gill Road area to tie up their dogs or restrain them from running loose for the next few weeks in an effort to discover if any other dogs have been bitten.

Mrs. Dowell reports this is the second time in two years her son has been bitten. She reported he was nipped around the eye two years ago by a stray dog. He was given a fourteen-shot treatment at that time, one injection each day for two weeks, and is going through the same procedure again.
