EXPECT SMELT RUNS TO START IN EARLY APRIL

When will the smelt run? Scooping up the little silvery fish in hand nets actually is legal now in non-trout streams. However conservation department records show most runs do not begin before early April and peak runs until days later.

An early spring hastens the start of the annual spawning runs, continued cold will delay the seasonal dashes up the many tributary streams of the Great Lakes. Usually, over 40 degree water temperatures are needed to induce a run and peak upstream movement develops in close to 50 degree temperature.

Two of the biggest run areas in recent years have been the Green bay tributary streams in Menominee and Delta counties and Saginaw bay tributary streams in Arenac, Huron and Iosco counties.

"Caine Mutiny"

A best seller on the lending shelves of the Farmington City and Township Library is Herman Wouk's "The Caine Mutiny".

The book is a maturing story of a fictitious Willie Keith, a Princeton graduate from well-to-do parents, who joins the Navy during World War II and struggles through midshipman school.

After graduation and his commission as an Ensign, Keith is assigned to the Caine, a minesweeper converted from a World War I destroyer which operates in the Pacific. After serving aboard the ship for several months Keith is delighted when he learns there is to be a change in the captain of the ship.

The new captain of the Caine is Lt. Commander Queeg, a regular Navy officer. After several months, talk inspired by another officer, Tom Keefe, leads junior officers of the Caine to question their captain's sanity. The conflict comes to a head during a typhoon when the executive officer, backed up by Keith, relieves the captain of his command.

Limit One Oil Well To Each Twenty Acres

One oil well to a 20-acre drilling unit in and around the new Dundee formation discovery in Isabella County has been approved by C. E. Eddy, conservation department director and supervisor of wells, and goes into effect immediately.

Charlton Oil Company, Pittsburg, which brought in the well northwest of Mt. Pleasant in section eight of Sherman Township December 31, withdrew its request for the supervisor to establish a maximum production allowable for the area.

Disapproved also was the request of Mogul Oil Company, Detroit, to alter the spacing rule from one to 20 acres to one to ten acres in the Mineral Springs pool, Oceola County.

Estimate Ore Reserves At 162,221,921 Tons

Michigan's 1952 iron ore reserves are estimated at 162,221,921 tons and worth about \$78,910,000 according to the conservation department's geological survey division.

This compares with 161,926,901 reserve tons with a final valuation of \$68,866,000 in 1951. Annual estimate is made for taxation purposes.

Wild Brook Trout Fly Beginning To Hatch

First hatch of spring for Hunt Creek trout fish technicians is the appearance of wild brook trout emerging out of the gravel. Reelless trout fishermen can take some comfort from the conservation. Good report of active feeding in silty stream backwaters. Fry are from eggs laid down by wild trout about deer season time last fall.
