The Farmington Baptist Church Easter Sunday, a spokesman for the church reported. Rev. Harold Moran, field agent for the Detroit Bible Institute, will address congregants at both services. In the first service, at 10 a.m., the choir will sing "Christ The Lord Is Risen Today" as processional. Soloist Sharop Andrews will sing "Hail Glorious Morning" during the service and the choir will sing "He Is Risen" for the anthem. The second service is at 7:30 in the evening.

Holy Week Triduum begins at Our Lady of Sorrows Church on Thursday. Rev. Fr. Thomas Beahan reported. Starting with a Solemn High Mass at 9 a.m. this morning, Adoration began and will continue today, through the night and end at 9 a.m. services Good Friday morning. The Thursday night and early Friday morning continuance of Adoration has been extended this year. Rev. Fr. Beahan reported. The church will be open all night. Adoration ceases Good Friday at 9 a.m. with Pre-Sanctified after which there will be Adoration of the Sacrament all day. Good Friday there will be a reading of the passion and the Stations of the Cross. At 7:30 p.m. Good Friday there will be Stations of the Cross. Saturday services begin at 7 a.m. with Blessing of the New Fire, Blessing of the Easter Candle, Easter Water and Baptismal Font followed by the sacrifice of the Mass at 8:15 a.m. Easter Sunday Masses will be at 7 a.m., 8:30 a.m., 9:45 a.m., 11:15 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Confessions begin Wednesday night and will be heard tonight, Friday evening and Saturday. Confession will be heard on Good Friday from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and Holy Saturday from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Fast and Abstinence cease at noon on Holy Saturday.

There will be services in St. Paul's Lutheran Church Thursday, Friday and Sunday. Rev. Walter Rutkowski reported. A Holy Communion service will be given in the church at 8 p.m. Thursday. At a Good Friday service starting at 8 p.m., the choir will sing and Rev. Rutkowski will deliver the sermon. are acceptable only with the written consent of parent or legal guardian. A person must weigh at least 110 pounds and must have a systolic blood pressure within the range of 100 to 200. Persons having received sulfa drugs, penicillin, aureomycin and similar drugs within a period of thirty days are not acceptable, nor are persons who have a history of heart disease or jaundice. Persons having had malaria will be acceptable as donors provided they have not had a recurrence within the past two years. Donors are asked not to eat any fats, cream, rich soups or gravies within four hours prior to giving blood.

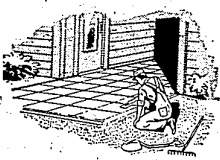
