This could go on for days.
Just what is the answer? Outside of an election there apparently isn't any. The two camps right now are sitting around the council fires plotting war strategy — and they will continue to do so until

there is a new governor or a Democratic legislature. Non-partisan government is a sorry mess.
Salary and wage costs to some 25,000 state employees an official hit \$103,614,489 in the last 15 months. In the same period of the first Williams administration they were \$88,421,466 and ten years ago the total was barely \$42 million.
But the legislature promises that by the end of the fiscal year there will be from 800 to 1,000 fewer state employees.

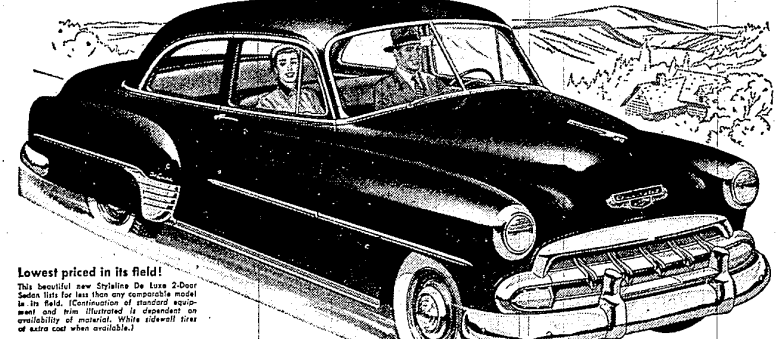
